NAAE National Award Applications

National Geographic Learning / Delmar Cengage Learning Upper Division Scholarship

Thanks to the generous sponsorship of [National Geographic Learning | Delmar Cengage Learning](#) and proceeds from the ticket raffle at the NAAE convention, NAAE will award scholarships to students who are majoring in agricultural education and who will be completing their student teaching in the fall 2016 or spring 2017 semesters. Previous recipients of the NAAE Upper Division Scholarship are not eligible.

National Agriscience Teacher of the Year

The National Agriscience Teacher of the Year award recognizes teachers who have inspired and enlightened their students through engaging and interactive lessons in the science of agriculture. Teachers who have previously been selected as National Finalist or awarded the National Agriscience Teacher of the Year award are ineligible to apply.

NAAE Outstanding Agricultural Education Teacher Award

This program distinguishes NAAE members who are at the pinnacle of their profession — those who are conducting the highest quality agricultural education programs. The award recognizes leadership in civic, community, agriculture/agribusiness and professional activities. Outstanding agricultural educators are innovators and catalysts for student success in agricultural education. Individuals may receive the regional award only once; previous regional winners are not eligible to apply.

NAAE Outstanding Young Member Award

As a means of encouraging young teachers to remain in the profession and to encourage and recognize participation in professional activities, the NAAE Outstanding Young Member Award program is sponsored by [John Deere](#) as a special project of the [National FFA Foundation](#). NAAE members who have completed at least three but not more than five years of teaching are eligible to apply for this award; members who are currently in their sixth year of teaching are eligible to apply. Individuals may receive the regional award only once; previous regional winners are not eligible to apply.

NAAE Outstanding Secondary/Middle School Program Award

A goal of NAAE is to promote outstanding programs in agricultural education and effectively communicate success stories. The Outstanding Middle/Secondary School Ag Ed Program Award promulgates that goal. Agricultural education programs in middle schools and secondary schools are eligible to participate in this recognition program.

NAAE Outstanding Postsecondary/Adult Education Program Award

The Outstanding Postsecondary/Adult Ag Ed Program award recognizes exemplary 2-year postsecondary institutions and full time young farmer and adult agricultural education programs. Qualifying young farmer and/or adult ag ed program staff must devote at least 50 percent of their teaching time to this level of instruction. Previous regional winners may reapply for this award every five years if they choose (that is, programs that won the regional award in 2013 may reapply in 2018).

NAAE “Teachers Turn the Key” Scholarship Application

Agricultural education is continually faced with a shortage of qualified teachers. Unless those who have been trained enter and remain in the profession for a period of several years, the shortage of qualified teachers will prevail. As a means of encouraging young teachers to remain in the profession and to encourage and recognize participation in professional activities, NAAE offers the Teachers Turn the Key Scholarship.

NAAE members who are currently in their second, third, or fourth year of teaching are eligible to apply for this award. Applicants must be a member of NAAE during the year of application (2014-2015) and be a member of NAAE at the time of the convention at which they receive their scholarship (2015-2016). Applicants must not have attended the NAAE convention previously. All state winners must agree to attend the entire NAAE convention.

NAAE Teacher Mentor Award Application

If you ask agriculture teachers what motivated them to enter and stay in the teaching profession, predominately they will attribute their decision to another agriculture teacher who encouraged them. Many state agricultural education associations have recognized the importance of positive relationships between beginning and experienced teachers by creating formal organizational structures to connect beginning and experienced teachers. This award program will provide additional incentives for experienced teachers to become mentors for beginning teachers, and it will provide beginning teachers a way to say thank you to the experienced teachers who have influenced them.

NAAE Award Application Process/Recommendations

Although the finalized applications for 2017 haven't yet been posted on the NAAE website, it is the recommendation of the board to encourage members interested in completing an application, to begin gathering information, while waiting for the official 2017 application to be posted. The supplementary material should be the same on all applications and this is the most important and lengthy component. Don't delay, start today!!

Application Preparation Process

Step 1 : Visit www.naae.org/resources/awards/index.cfm to access the application information for each application you are interested in applying for,

Step 2 : Begin gathering pictures, newspaper articles, letters of recommendation and the like, for the supplementary section of the application.

Step 3 : Work gradually through the application. Don't expect to complete the application in one evening. A quality application will take time.

Step 4 : Have someone proofread your work. We are all teachers, use the English/Language Arts teacher to proof for grammar/spelling errors. Ask a fellow agriculture teacher to read through your application and give any recommendations. Make changes.

Step 5 : Edit, again.

Step 6 : Final printing and signatures.
